MIKE TEDRICK

Mike graduated from The Ohio State University in 1978 with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Microbiology. From 1978 – 1983 he worked for the Dept. of Agriculture as an Inspector of Amusement Rides and Retail Food Establishments. In 1984 he joined the Columbus Health Dept as a Food Inspector. Mike was promoted to a Dept. Coordinator in 1999 overseeing the activities of 10 field sanitarians.

In 1980 Robin's Amusement Ride Co. was created with three small kiddie rides. It grew to a nine ride show in the late 80's but has found its comfort level with six rides over the past 8 years. Mike has had duties at the Ohio State Fair as either a Ride Inspector (1979 –1984) or as a Food Inspector (1985 – present). Since 1995 he has been in charge of all Health Dept inspections during the Ohio State Fair and many other major events concerning Concessionaires.
